

## California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) 2025-2026

The Cal-GETC is the singular lower division general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students transferring to both the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC).

1. Transfer to the CSU system involves achieving junior status by completing 60 CSU-transferable units with a minimum GPA of 2.0, including general education, major preparation, and/or electives. Similarly, transferring to the UC system involves achieving junior status by completing 60 UC-transferable units with a minimum GPA of 2.4. A maximum of 70 units are applied to the bachelor's degree after transfer.
2. Cal-GETC certification requires completion of all requirements passed with a minimum grade of C prior to transfer.
3. Cal-GETC certification is not a requirement for admission to most UCs and CSUs. See an Academic Counselor and/or visit [assist.org](https://assist.org) for more information.
4. Students whose majors require more than 30 units are encouraged to see an Academic Counselor and/or visit [assist.org](https://assist.org) regarding the advisability of completing all major requirements instead of all general education requirements.
5. A course must be taken during a term approved for Cal-GETC (see [assist.org](https://assist.org)). A course may be approved in multiple Cal-GETC areas, but can only be used to satisfy a single Area 1-6 requirement. IGETC courses taken prior to Fall 2025 may be included in Cal-GETC certification if the courses are also approved for the corresponding Cal-GETC Area (see FAQs for SPCH 010).
6. Continuing students who began at a CCC prior to Fall 2025 and have maintained rights to the former general education patterns may qualify for IGETC and/or CSU GE certification in lieu of Cal-GETC certification. See an Academic Counselor for details.

### UC Graduation Requirement – LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

This graduation requirement varies by UC campus. Students are advised to consult with a UC admissions representative to confirm whether a PCC course listed below fulfills the requirement at their intended campus. Typically, proficiency equivalent to two years of high school study in the same language or completion of one of the courses below satisfies the requirement. Students who received formal education in grades 6-12 taught in a language other than English should see an Academic Counselor.

## Common Course Numbering Crosswalk

The Common Course Numbering (CCN) system is a state-mandated initiative (AB 1111) designed to simplify student transfer and ensure uniformity in course numbering across California Community Colleges. Below is a list of courses offered at PCC, comparing the former course subject and number with the new course subject and number based on the CCN system.

Courses completed prior to the CCN system can be applied to Cal-GETC as long as the former version was approved for the equivalent area on IGETC.

## Rights to Former General Education Patterns

Cal-GETC certification is not required for students with:

- Continuous enrollment prior to Fall 2025 (i.e. enrolled in at least one regular semester each academic year).
- Official transcripts indicating conferral of an Associate Degree for Transfer or full certification of IGETC or CSU GE Breadth.

Students who began prior to Fall 2025 have rights to the former transfer general education patterns of IGETC or CSU GE Breadth.

- Students may present an IGETC-UC certification to the UC beginning with the version that was current when they began at a CCC.
- Students may present an IGETC-CSU certification or CSU GE Breadth certification to the CSU beginning with the version that was current when they began as an undergraduate at a CSU or a CCC if they were continuously enrolled and maintained catalog rights (i.e. enrolled in at least one regular semester each academic year).

## Frequently Asked Questions

1. Is Cal-GETC certification required for transfer?  
Cal-GETC certification is typically not required for transfer to a CSU or UC, however, some impacted programs may require completion of a general education pattern.
2. I earned an A in SPCH 010 in Fall 2024 and want to get Cal-GETC certification. Can I use SPCH 010 on Cal-GETC?  
SPCH 010 completed prior to Fall 2025 is only applicable to IGETC Area 1C or CSU GE Area A1. SPCH 010 is not applicable to Cal-GETC Area 1C.
3. I graduated high school in Spring 2025 and was concurrently enrolled at PCC and/or took dual enrollment classes at my high school. Am I able to follow the IGETC or CSU GE Breadth if I want to transfer to a CSU?  
If you remained continuously enrolled, you are eligible for CSU GE Breadth or IGETC-CSU certification. If you had a break in enrollment after your last concurrent/dual enrolled course and return to PCC in Fall 2025 or later, you'll only be eligible for Cal-GETC certification.
4. Can I follow Cal-GETC if I'm a continuing student and started at PCC prior to Fall 2025?  
Yes! Students have the option to switch over to Cal-GETC, but are not required to. Students may be certified based on the GE pattern in place when they began at and/or returned to a CCC, or the pattern in place at the time of certification.
5. Can I use AP credit on Cal-GETC?  
Yes! AP tests passed with a score of 3 or higher earn college credit, and select AP credit may be applied to Cal-GETC. Refer to the [AP chart in the College Catalog](#) to determine which Cal-GETC Area each test applies to.
6. I've taken courses at another college. Can I use those for Cal-GETC certification?  
Courses from California Community Colleges will be applied to the subject area in which it is listed by the institution where the course was completed. You can find this information on [assist.org](#). Appropriate courses completed at institutions with ICAS approved accreditation may be applied to subject areas after a transcript evaluation.
7. What are UC transfer credit limitations?  
Units from courses with overlapping content may not apply separately towards the 60 units required for transfer to the UC (i.e. if you completed BUS 014B and then MATH 005A, only one of those courses will apply towards transfer to the UC). You can consult with an Academic Counselor and/or refer to the UC Transferable Courses list on [assist.org](#) to learn the details about each UC credit limitation noted in the courses above on Cal-GETC.
